Goals: Theatre In-Education is a special learning skill developed in Britain in 1960s to join force of school systems and theatre groups for the purpose of teaching arts and safely experiencing real life situations to high school students. It brings theatre artists to schools to work with teachers and students to better understand some human issues through relive historical events. The activities are highly structured and materials carefully researched so that the outcome is closely resembled to history but participants will have a better understanding of how the decisions were made and what considerations were involved while making the decisions. The TIE involves both theatre artists (actors/teachers) and audience (students/participants). The students who take this course will learn the know-how of TIE first and then, based on their own teaching experience, propose workable strategies of TIE application in their own teaching environments.

Course Outline: The central theme for this year's course is "Utopia: an environmental friendly society". Parts of outdoor campus (山頂公園) will be used as the locale of the Utopia. Some projects will be executed there. The course is divided into two parts: the first is the theories and techniques of TIE and the second is the assessment of TIE incorporation into the school curriculum.

Teaching Style: This course is conducted entirely in English. The instructor will function as a guiding force in motivating creative thinking and in building learning and teaching materials. She will explain the rationale and the application of each project. Students will be asked to work individually and/or in groups, to participate in class activities and to find materials for projects and how to apply them in their future teaching situation..
